As an educational arena, the Demonstration Garden contains a wide variety of fruits, vegetables, perennials and annuals— as well as a dedicated composting area.

Master Gardeners are committed to an environmentally sound Loudoun County and its watersheds; therefore, the garden is a synthetic chemical-free environment that protects our water quality and ecosystem.

The produce harvested from the garden, over 11,500 lbs. in six years, is donated to Loudoun Hunger Relief.

Directions to the Garden

From downtown historic Leesburg, at the intersection of Rt. 7 (Market St) and Rt. 15 (King St), go north on Rt. 15 (King St) for 1/2 mile. Turn left into Ida Lee Park. Take the first right toward the Demonstration Gardens. Take another right after the barn into the parking area. The MG Garden is south of the community plots.
